Year-to-date, LVR has purchased ~48 pounds of beans. This is all a part of our vision to focus on our locally-roasted beans via expansion of sales and supply. So, we didn't stop there! This year, we became the official bean supplier for Brumley's Restaurant and General Morgan Inn Banquets. Beyond that, we sell our bags of whole beans in our downtown location and at Uncommon Collective in the Greeneville Commons. This is all a huge win because it is a step in the direction God has called us. It's in our name: Coffee is how we remain a Catalyst.



Finances

We asked a couple veteran FCCers to anonymously share their story of learning to pursue generosity. While some biographical and timing details have been significantly changed to keep their identities anonymous, the salient points are all true and accurate. The following is an excerpt from their story.

When we got married many eons ago, we wanted to make sure we "started out right" by faithfully contributing to our church. We knew giving to the church was an important part of helping fund its staff, programs, ministries, and missionary endeavours, and even an important part of living out our Christian faith.

So we did what seemed natural and reasonable. We began to put together our budget based on all the normal things we knew we needed—housing, food, transportation, insurance, healthcare, pets, misc/unexpected, fun, etc.—and then we took out for savings, retirement, investments, and a couple other long-term goals.

Over the years, as God blessed us with children, promotions at our jobs, and additional

responsibilities and resources, we increased our

regular giving a few times and gave to other church needs we felt led to help with. That seemed like plenty.

Well, after we came to FCC, we were consistently challenged to think "intentionally" about our Christian life and occasionally even our giving. This wasn't exactly new for us, but God had plans for our growth we didn't know when we first came.

Since then it has slowly become a habit of thinking, praying, talking, and learning together about biblical financial stewardship that learns contentment and builds security through Give, Save, Live. No, it hasn't been easy. But it has been good! We have learned the joy of sacrificing for the cause of Christ in a way that has deepened our love for His sacrifice for us.

Life Groups

Connecting in a Small Group is crucial for building healthy long-term relationships with other believers that can become the Goddesigned environment for your connection and care.

At FCC, Life Groups are the frontline for connection, pastoral care, and community service. Life Groups provide a safe and challenging environment for people to Find and Follow Jesus, and then grow in their faith and work together to Tell the Story to the wider community.

As the launch team for FCC's South Greene campus formed in 2022, Ken and Carla Nickle and David and Dawn Wells were quick to jump on board. The new campus was closer to where they lived, and they relished the opportunity to be a part of something new. The two couples also agreed to participate in a Leadership Life Group crash course, a four-session group formed to help prepare new Life Group Leaders as the South Greene campus was launching. The two couples decided to co-lead a group, which has now grown to six couples and meets weekly.

Their commitment to co-leading has also had unexpected consequences for David and Dawn. According to Dawn, "Stepping outside our comfort zone by co-leading has not only enabled us to grow individually but also as a couple as we are intentional about discussing Sunday's sermon and prepping for our next gathering. This area of spiritual discussion was lacking in our marriage — and that void is now filled!"


Marriage Team

Through Merge, they are given the opportunity to learn, seek wisdom, and receive Biblical counsel about marriage in a safe, fun, challenging, and authentic small group environment.

When David Bowlin and Melody Steele attended Merge earlier this year, they were only dating but, as Melody says, "Merge brought so much clarity and peace and was super helpful for us taking our step toward engagement!" When asked what was helpful toward that end, she shared that the detailed content and intentional questions helped them think through who they were called to marry and to serve.

Furthermore, Melody said, "Merge began to break our pride, called us to a higher form of selflessness, and was the beginning of the oneness and closeness we are pursuing today."





David added, "The personal nature of Merge meant that we were intentionally poured into by

leaders who cared for us. They met with us, answered our questions, and calmed our foolish anxieties. They called us out on our sin, and showed us how our future marriage was to reflect Christ and the Church. We are grateful, and so excited for our future!"

We praise the Lord for the growing number of couples like David and Melody who are humbly seeking God's desire for their relationship through Merge and count it a privilege to have a marriage ministry ready to help them succeed in marriage, all for the glory of God.







Missions & Outreach

Every other summer, our ONEEIGHTY students go on a mission trip. This past May, ten high school students and four courageous adults spent nine days working with FCC missionaries, Steve and Kay Carpenter in Tultepec, Mexico. They helped spread the gospel while also learning more about the Mexican people and their culture.

Despite extreme sickness and fatigue the group recalled that it was God who helped them through the week. "Watching the youth of FCC witness to and build relationships with the Mexican people was like watching prayers come to life," adult leader Jama Doty noted. "Not only the prayers we prayed specifically for this mission trip but the prayers that parents of our young people have prayed over them for the entirety of their lives. That type of ability to express the love of Jesus doesn't just happen. It's something that has been fostered all their lives. Parents, you should be proud of your children and the love they were able to share!"

Hannah Staggs recalled. "We will never forget everything God did through the people, the Carpenters, and us in Mexico."

Travis Chapman, Students Director, summarized what he hopes each of the team members as they returned home. "The Lord has placed each of us in Greene County Tennessee. He has placed us in the lives of people here. Let's allow this trip to be a reminder that Christ is building His Church everywhere and the gates of Hell will not prevail against it, fuel to be on mission here in Greene County because the souls here are just as precious, and a memory that we can look back to when we are tempted to complain because our limits are tested or our comfort is disrupted."

Pillar

Young Adults at First Christian Church, known as "Pillar," was established with the intention of reflecting the value of being a steadfast support, echoing the sentiment from 1 Timothy 3:15 that the church of the living God is a pillar of truth. This ministry recognizes that by becoming established in a church body, young adults can experience meaningful growth and develop into pillars of truth for the world.

Over the past year, we have witnessed a growing number of young adults becoming members of our church, and one such individual is Zoe Breeding. In 2021, Zoe initially visited FCC and found our streaming of sermons to be somewhat strange. However, in 2022, she attended a service at Pillar and was captivated. Zoe recalls, "I really liked it, so I kept coming back. When I realized that our approach here aligns with how Sundays are run, I overcame my initial reservations about the technology aspect. I hadn't found a church home until then, so I committed myself to attending. Since then, my family has followed suit, and we have been here ever since."





Zoe officially became a member of our church this year and expressed, "Early last year, after a

year of fruitless church hunting, I met a member of FCC who invited me to Pillar. Witnessing the intentionality and Christ-centeredness of this community, I made the decision to make FCC my new church home!"

Today, Zoe plays a vital role in our church family. She is a leader at Pillar, a barista at Catalyst, a committed member of a Life Group, and faithfully attends the Afton Campus where she and her fiancée assist with the Kids setup. It is truly inspiring to witness the young adults BEING the Church, embodying the ideals of being pillars of truth.

Re:gen is Bible-based and gospel-centered discipleship training focused on deeply understanding identity in Christ by applying God's grace. This community meets every Monday evening at our Greeneville Campus, providing a safe and supportive space for individuals from diverse backgrounds to come together. From 6:30 - 8:30p, participants gather to share their struggles, build deep and lasting roots in a daily and abiding walk with Christ, and find freedom.

At the core of re:gen's culture is a strong emphasis on leadership development. Currently, we have a dedicated team of 22 leaders who invest their time and energy into our community on a weekly basis. Before each re:gen session, our leaders engage in a dynamic 45-minute leadership development meeting, where they enhance their skills and knowledge. These sessions cover a range of topics, including theology, handling specific struggles, establishing healthy boundaries, and offering support to participants in crisis situations, among others.





Our commitment to leadership growth and learning extends beyond our local community.

Recently, nine of our re:gen leaders had the invaluable opportunity to attend the Church Leader's Conference in Texas. This event provided them with firsthand insights into how Watermark Community Church successfully operates their re:gen program, which serves over 1,000 participants. During the conference, crucial subjects such as burnout prevention, group and individual safety, as well as caring for abuse victims, were extensively discussed.

Through our ongoing training and leadership development efforts, we are actively advancing God's mission in Greene County. Our aim is to love God and love others in personal and effective ways, ensuring that everyone who walks through our doors finds the support, encouragement, and resources they need to thrive on their spiritual journey.

Student Team

The 180 Student Team has implemented a lead small, gender, and grade-specific small group strategy aimed at Helping Students Find and Follow Jesus. The unique aspect of this strategy is the focus on longevity in small group leadership, with each Small Group Leader (SGL) being trained and encouraged to stay with their group from 6th grade until high school graduation. This emphasis on continuity has led to the formation of remarkable relational discipleship communities.

Michelle Hamilton, who has dedicated over 20 years to ministry with students, is a prime example of the positive outcomes of this approach. One of her former students, Amy Bailey, not only returned to serve on the Student Team but also received training from Michelle herself. They both shared their thoughts on the experience. Michelle expressed her joy in being involved in student ministry and witnessing the transformation of disciples into disciplemakers. She highlighted the Holy Spirit's work through young leaders, as they passionately share their love for Jesus and their journey of faith with younger individuals. It is a source of great joy for her to see this cycle of ministry unfold.

Amy, who was mentored by Michelle during her high school years, spoke highly of the inspiration and encouragement she received from her. Michelle's teachings about God's Word and her support during difficult times left a lasting impact on Amy. Now, Amy herself is being guided by Michelle in teaching young girls, and she is excited about the opportunity to influence others, just as Michelle did for her.

Overall, the lead small, gender and grade-specific small group strategy employed by the 180 Student Team has proven to be highly effective in helping students grow in their faith and become disciple-makers themselves, creating a powerful ripple effect within the community.
